Dear Parent/Guardian:

We have identified several children with head lice. We would appreciate your help in attempting to control the spread of this common childhood problem. The following are some suggestions that we would recommend that you discuss as a family:

1. Do not use another person's hairbrush or comb.
2. Do not wear another person's hat, coat, jacket, sweater, or other article of clothing.
3. Do not share baseball caps, football helmets, or jerseys or other clothing of any type.
4. Do not share sleeping bags, pillows or other bedding with another person.

The following is what you should look for in searching for head lice:

1. Persistent itching of the scalp.
2. Nits – small, silvery eggs attached to the hair $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch away from the scalp. Most often these are found in areas around the ears and in the back of the neck.
3. You may occasionally see the immature louse which looks like a flea or the mature louse which is grayish in color and approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ inch long. These crawl on the scalp and feed on the blood supply of the scalp, causing small sores to form on the scalp.

The following are some steps which you should take if you find evidence of head lice or nits:

1. Contact your family doctor for treatment.
2. Call your school health clinic.
3. Notify all neighbors, relative, babysitters or day care centers that your child has had contact with in the past month.
4. Curtail staying overnight with friends or relatives.

For your information, the school district observes the following procedure once we have discovered head lice or nits on a school child:

1. The parent/guardians are notified.
2. The child may return to school when proper treatment has been completed and there are no signs of active infestation.
3. The school health aid will recheck children with 7 to 10 days to determine, if re-infestation has occurred.

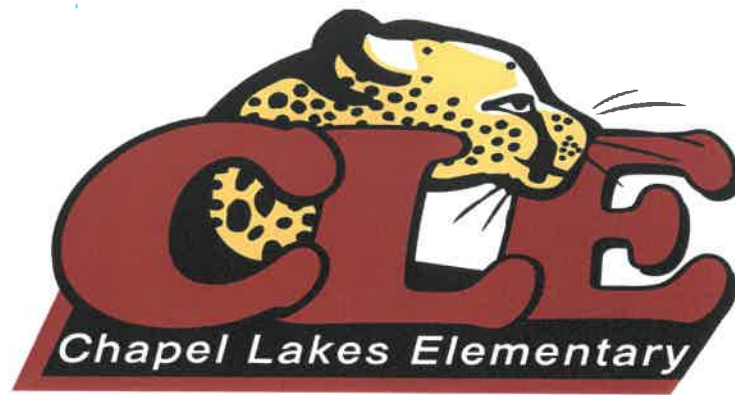
